I'm pretty sure most of the American nuclear weapons are pointed at Russia ever since the beginning of the Cold War. That's got to give people bad dreams. Who invented those nuclear weapons anyways? [Who started that whole MAD "game?"](#) Why? Is it really necessary? Does anyone wonder about the dreams and [nightmares of children](#) knowing those other people far away have nuclear missiles pointed at them? I know it does. I've had nightmares about being hunted and homeless since the Cuban Missile Crisis in 1962.

I wonder if the good people in the world will ever [link up and demand more from the rich](#), or if the poor everywhere will just live in fear and poverty like slaves for the rest of time?

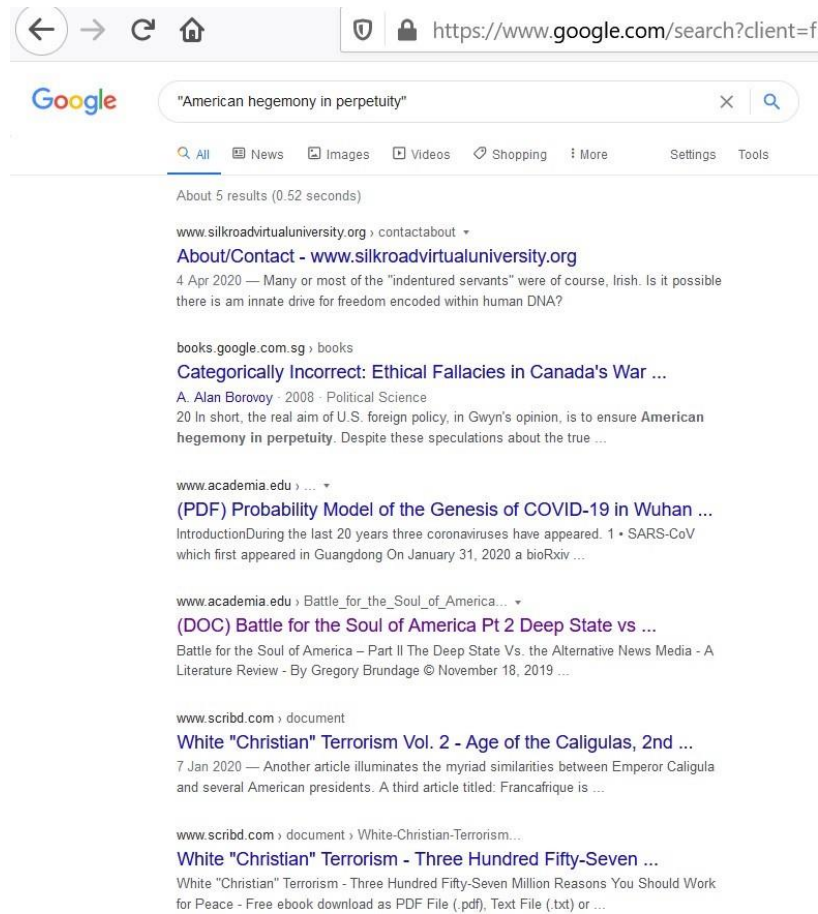

3. "Recent estimates for global poverty are that [9.2% of the world, or 689 million people](#), live in extreme poverty on \$1.90 or less a day, according to the World Bank. In the United States, 11.8% of the population or 38.1 million people, live in poverty — with an income of less than \$33.26 per day — according to the 2018 census." That was before COVID-19. Now...
